There are different level of schools in the Department of Education of the Church of Bangladesh, especially the primary schools, are playing a key role in the village. In addition, the high schools maintain their standardized education, curriculum and creative methods. As a result, the name of the mission school is still with fame for better service. There are 39 schools in total. The CoB is running seven high Schools, The government registered with Monthly Pay Order MPO listed are five and the rest 34 are run by the Church directly. Total Students are 8,420 and number of teachers are 315 in total.

At present, the education system of Bangladesh has improved further. That is why we too have changed

the education system. The teaching process has been started in all schools creatively and every class is taken according to the lesson plan. If all goes well this month may be the 1st terminal test is scheduled. There are plans to arrange teacher training for teachers next month.

In the current context, the government has promoted free education in primary schools. And there are schools in every village or locality. However, because of the good quality of education and the name of the missionary school, the students come to our school. Besides, somewhere the number of students is also decreasing due to the number of families and the number of members in the villages for climate change effect.

Likewise, the children who come to our schools from the slums are really vulnerable. They do not have any voice to raise help from the Government or from anywhere. Thomas' Cathedral, 54, Johnson Road, Dhaka. The Moderator of Church of Bangladesh Rt. Rev. Samuel Sunil Mankhin, Moderator's Secretary & Synod Admin. Mr. Prodip Chand Mondal, Head of MSP4, Mr. Paul Subrata

Malakar, Former Swarupantor Coordinator Mr. Tarun Mondol, Chaplain Rev. Simson Mazumder, and present Swarupantor & Health Coordinator Mr. Philip Mondol along with 8 Catechists from Rajshahi Deanery and 15 staffs of health and Swarupantor from Haluaghat and Madhupur deanery were present. The main theme is "Cast all your anxieties on him because he cares for you" (I Peter 5:7).

The awareness training for the staff was held on 23-24 February, 2020 at St. Andrew's Mission, Haluaghat, and Mymensingh. Dean of Haluaghat, Rev. labor and only one earning member in the family.

She said, "I was a housewife and my husband Liton Richil is a daily labor and only one earning member in our family. I attend awareness sessions, training on chicken/duck rearing and goat rearing. After the training I got input support to purchase 4 goats and started my goats rearing to communicate with govt. line department as per learning of my training. Now I have 16 goats and made a farm. Recently I have started poultry rearing by selling goats. Now I have a poultry farm also. It is possible to get success because I had training and accept the challenges. I worked hard and use my knowledge. I am very much thankful and grateful



to SHALOM for giving me the opportunity to be a member of the group, inspiring me to make my future and made self-employment."

*Purpose: Prepare long term strategy of Church of Bangladesh aligned with the Vision, Mission, Values, Approaches and priority for achieving local level sustainability*  
*Funding: GBP15, 000 (ACF) +5,000 (USPG) in 2019 {confirmed} and GBP15, 000 + 4,000 in 2020 {Tentative approval}*  
*Proposed Date: 1/1/2019 starting and 31/12/2020 ending*

## Intro

We are blessed to have adequate local resources in order and our hearts tuned to the Gospel. In order for these blessings to become self-sustaining and then to be given back as blessings, we are proposing a strategic plan to become self-reliant through utilizing the resources. We believe that blessings come in the form of relationships and while we love our neighbours we would like to provide a space where they can be safe, comfortable and inspired through a contextual strategic plan.

## Achieved so far

PESTLE (Political, Economic, Social, Technological, Legal and Environment) Analysis: present situation and trend, Mission specific land scape assessment done. SWOC (Strength & Weakness (Internal), Opportunities and Challenges (External) analysis done on 10-11 February 2020, Performance Assessment: Assessment of CoB and its institutional performance through Focused Group Discussion, Key Informant Interviews, Survey on Partners/Donors perception, Data Collection is conducted, Data are being analysed for a detailed report for stepping forward to analyse the gap.

We had initial introductory meeting with Mr. Davidson Solanki of USPG at Savar on February 20, 2019 when we finalized the ToR of the Strategy Development Team and proposed three other Teams at Diocese level who will carry out the role at Diocese level in close consultation and guidance from the Strategy Team. The Strategy Team and ToR was finalized and circulated among all stakeholders.

We then conducted the SDT launching Workshop at Savar on March 12, 2019 where the overview of the Project and project implementation plan and schedule was shared and agreed. Also, shared the various tools

that will be used by the Teams for donor's opinion survey, FGD with stakeholders for Ministry and Capacity Assessment etc. Vision, Mission, Strategic goal and Objectives have been found out through series of workshop and necessary meetings with community leaders, lay people and clergies. The steps are now remaining to validate the goals and objectives through diocese executive and synod executives. We need prayer from our mission partners. 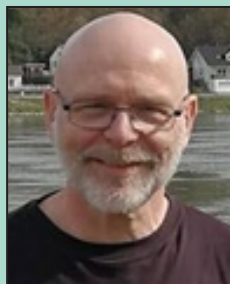

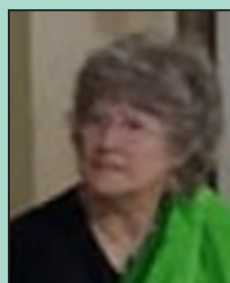
