Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

On behalf of the Church of Bangladesh, I extend my sincere respect and best wishes to all. During this time, I was deeply saddened to hear the news of the deaths of Mrs. Monika Mannan and Dr James Tejosh Das. We mourn for this great loss for whole of the Christian Community of Bangladesh.

I would like to share with all of you what the Honourable Moderator of the CWM's' Special Members' Meeting 'said most recently on March 31, 2021. The Honourable Moderator read the Bible from 2 Corinthians 6: 4-10, urging us to respond to the apostle Paul's call. Even in the midst of a deadly Covid-19

situation, we should not stop trying our best. But in the light of the prospect of Christ's resurrection, we should always keep going on. There has been a lot of frustration in our lives, and it is time to move forward in the certainty of the resurrection of Christ Jesus. Because the resurrection of Jesus Christ includes the redemption, salvation, and eternal life of all sinful people.

He also cited a dance performed at an African wedding, where the dancers move forward with two legs in front and then two legs in the back, thus implying that there must be success behind such a life. We will also get over everything and live like such a wedding dance. He then briefly sheds light on six paradoxes about the expansion of God's kingdom and the achievement of the goals set by his servants:

1. glory and dishonor, 2. bad report and good report; 3. genuine, yet regarded as impostors; 4. known, yet regarded as unknown; 5 dying, and yet we live on; beaten, and yet not killed; 6. sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; poor, yet making many rich; having nothing, and yet possessing everything.



My Dorm Our Home

(End of Project report)

"My Dorm Our Home" (MDOH), a media project to build social cohesion among migrant workers in Singapore, and to strengthen their communal and social-emotional resilience during the COVID-19 period and beyond. Project My Dorm Our Home was one such effort initiated by Diocese of Singapore and The Anglican Relief and Development Agency International (ARDA Intl), Church of Bangladesh. As the COVID-19 virus silently reached Singapore's shores and began spreading, migrant worker dormitories became serious hotspots and dominated the national headlines. To flatten the curve, the many thousands of migrant workers, including Bangladeshi Migrant workers in both large purposebuilt dorms and factory-converted ones were placed in strict lockdown, along with the rest of Singapore.

My Dorm our home project started its journey from 1st April 2020 and ever since then over 50 episodes of different programmes focusing on the wellbeing of Bangladeshi migrant workers has been aired on the facebook based platform. My Dorm Our home project consisted of a variety of shows starting with the first ever social media based talent show for Bangladeshi migrant workers "My Dorm Our home Idol hunt". A total of 10 contestants from 100 entries were selected to bottle it out in a 4 part series and at the end reign as the champion. The show included celebrity guest judges and performances and cash prizes for first and second place contestants.

The project delivered 80 shows and the digital reach is more than 850,000. Total view in social media is over 175,000 and total engagement is over 220,000.

The advocacy team has strongly advocated to help poor

The social, health, education, housing, employment, economic and cultural rights are considered as human rights in Bangladesh, but most of the poor citizens are deprived from these rights. Ethnic people in Bangladesh especially in Baromari, Durgapur upazila under Netrokona district face violence and discrimination in many facets of their lives, including attacks on their physical safety (especially ethnic women), barriers to equal access to healthcare, fair and safe employment, and education, food and nutritional security, safe drinking water and hygienic sanitation. Apart of that, the people of Baromari are yet to overcome social problems like religious conservatism, child marriage, dowry, polygamy, divorces, and abandonment of wives by husbands living separately in distant places. High rates of unemployment, loose family relationships, little control over children, easy availability of drugs, have been widening scope for drug addiction by the children, adolescents and youngsters. Shalom is implementing Poverty Reduction and Community Resilience Project (PRCRP) supported by BftW and established three Advocacy Teams in three

unions in Durgapur Upazila with 63 members. Every Advocacy Team formed by an Executive Committee with 7 members; Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and executive members. The Advocacy Team conducted monthly meetings in the same date and same place. Everyone reports on the progress of the work as planned for the last month and it is spontaneously discussed and decided in detail with the participation of all and recorded in minutes. Regularly communicate with the local government, working overall to get opportunities from the local government; in particular to stand the helpless people by the Chairman of the Upazila, Local Union Parishad, Ward Members, Women Members from the Advocacy Team. Through the discussion of the advocacy team, the Durgapur Upazila Livestock Department has officially distributed 12 cows to 12 members in 3 unions. The advocacy team has strongly advocated at the government level to help three poor and homeless members to build houses. As well as the team is working for VGF cards, VGD cards, old age allowance, widow allowance and so many govt. services.





Christian Ministry to Children and Youth (CMCY) bearing Reg. # 1140 is a Childcare section of the Church of Bangladesh and kindly financing from the overseas partners of Christian Mission Service (CMS) Switzerland, Christian Missionsdienst e.V (CMD) Germany, Operation Agri, Uk and Compassion International Bangladesh (CIB) supporting poor and needy children to grow up holistically.



Nabokoli's Beauty parlor serves its' purposes

Even in the Coronavirus consequences, the Nabokoli beauty-shop runs maintaining safety health and serves its' purposes well. This beauty shop helps poor and education drop out teen-girls' to grow up as a skilled worker on it to survive in life with dignity and care.

Digitization helps CMCY to carry on works with discipline

From the last March 18, 2020, CMCY programs are greatly affected by the Coronavirus pandemic. Projects are closed and thus the students are imprisoned at homes. But the digitization helps and ensures CMCY to perform both the administrative and communications liaisons along with the overseas partners, project staff and children on time and a success.

Approval of St. George College Hostel, Mymensingh

CMCY has received green signal about funding from the kind donors of CMD and CMS for the St. George College Hostel, Mymensingh from June 2021. The St. George college hostel will help poor but meritorious students to come up in life with discipline and victory.

Food items distribution

1103 CMCY children have receive BDT 1000.00 for food with other possible support for education and health care, regularly and CIB (Compassion International Bangladesh) benefitted 2509 children have received food packages with rice-14 kg. Pulseone and half kg. Soyabin oil 500 gram.Potetoos-4 kg. Soap-2, Mask-2.

Christian Mission Hospital, Rajshahi

From April 14, 2021, the nation-wide lockdown is ongoing in Bangladesh, in context of the high surge of new corona case detection. With road communication stopped and public offices and schools and colleges closed, the situation has restricted the movement of the people.

But Christian Mission Hospital Rajshahi (CMHR) is open, in the midst of such challenges, with availability of its outpatient and inpatient services like before. Patients with acute necessities and clinical problems are coming almost every day, though slightly lower in number. Patients are being admitted and treated, normal deliveries done and various operations undertaken.

During this time on April 29, 2021, a special orientation-cum-demonstration for CMHR clinical staff was organized. Dr Be-nazir Ahmmad, MBBS, DCH, FCPS (Pediatrics), who is the Assistant Professor of the government Medical College at Rajshahi and who also helps CMHR as Consultant Pediatrician, conducted this orientation. He in particular talked on: "How And When To Use the Incubator for Newborns?"

In this connection it is very relevant and mention worthy that CMHR did not have this incubator facility for long in the past because hospital's old incubator was out of order. Recently engineers worked on it and with this high-end machinery now functioning normally, CMHR is presently able to provide more efficient and much needed life saving clinical care for more people, especially to the critical newborns.

There were about 25 staff members in the demonstration by Dr Be-nazir Ahmmad and they included hospital doctors, nurses and ward and OT staff.

An Iftar party of the CMHR was held to pray to God and seek forgiveness from sin and relief from COVID-19



For the first time in the 100-year history of the Christian Mission Hospital in Rajshahi, Iftar party has been organized. The event was held at the premises of the Nursing Institute adjacent to the hospital on Wednesday.

However, it was not only the followers of Islam who took part in it. All the officials and employees of the Hindu, Muslim and Christian communities working in the hospital and Nursing Institute including Local Working Committee Meeting took part in the event of this iftar to ask forgiveness and COVID-19 free world. In this event, people all over the world are praying for COVID-19 salvation.

The Christian Hospital in Rajshahi is a centenary institution. Adjacent to the hospital is the Christian Mission Nursing Institute. Majority of the doctors, teachers, staff and nurses working in the two institutions are from Muslim Community. This Iftar ceremony was organized in their honor. Teachers and students of the Nursing Institute also took part in it. The munajat-prayer was conducted by Maulana Tabibur Rahman, Imam of Paba Darusa Mosque in the district. He prayed for the harmony of people and grace of Almighty God so that people of the world can get relief from this tension and uncertainty soon.

Bollobhpur Hospital

Easter has come and gone in all its glory Maundy Thursday brought our hospital chaplain to celebrate the sacrament with us.

Palm Sunday and the students processed around the wards and grounds, palm crosses that they had made, and fronds from the palm trees held high, a long singing joyful procession.

Yes, we are still all inside the hospital, and our little chapel is the centre on our lives. We are still very careful, not allowing them outside, apart from the three village satellite clinics we are still running each week.

Easter Sunday, and we are all together in a beautifully decorated chapel and again processing around the wards, and alongside all these happy activities, the students are managing their times of duty on the wards, caring for their patients, delivering their babies, feeding the tiny infants in the incubators, and looking after their grannies and grand-dads in the geriatric ward. We are proud of them all.

And the best news of all is the arrival of Dr. Christopher Baroi, to take up the post of Medical Officer which has been vacant since Dr. Barsha left us last year in October.

He is accompanied by his energetic wife, who in no time at all has turned the barren doctor quarter into an oasis of flower gardens, and already a handsome Rooster can be seen strutting around the grounds, flanked by his six wives(hens) and seven ducks have also joined the family



Doctor Baroi is past retiring age, which is ideal for Bollobhpur Hospital, and he and his wife have thrown themselves wholly into the life of the hospital, taking 24 hours on call responsibility for any patient, and never missing the morning services in the chapel. Thanks be to God, we are grateful indeed.

And in the Nursing Training Centre, our newest group of sixteen students have completed their three months preliminary training school, sat and passed the final examination and await the capping ceremony and their new uniforms.

But this must wait until next month. Please keep us all in your prayer.

He reminded them that Bible school is not like our elementary primary or high school. May all the children come to learn with joy and grow in the Christian faith.

The same training was organized for Khulna Deanery from 15th to March 17th at Christ the King Church, Khalishpur, Khulna. Total thirty teachers attended the training. Respected Bishop participated in the training

program. There he encouraged the teachers to train the children creatively and encouraged all to use the materials they have received from MSP4.

He also thanked everyone, especially Mr Paul S. Malakar, Rev. Simson Mazumder, Rev. Monindra Baidya and Rev. Shanti Mondal, to conduct and host the training. Bishop also thanked Rt. Rev. Samuel S Mankhin for his supervision.

Formation and Workshop of Digital Platform for Religious Leaders

A digital platform for religious leaders was formed, and World Vision Bangladesh organized a workshop on preventing child marriage and physical punishment.

There was a discussion on the basic principles of child protection in the light of Islam and Christianity and children's rights. In this dialogue, Barisal Diocesan Bishop Shourabh Pholia presented a paper on the basic principles of child protection in the light of Christianity and teaching against child marriage and physical punishment.

There were thirty Muslim and Christian key religious leaders in the workshop, and the majority of them are Imams and priests from Barishal. From the Church of Bangladesh, Rev. Albert Halder attended the seminar.

Maulana Md. Osman Gani, Joint Secretary, Bangladesh National Imam Samity, Dhaka, Fr. Anol Terence D'Costa, Secretary, Barishal Diocese Roman Catholic Church, Mr Mridul Tazu, National Faith and Development Co-coordinator, Ms Lima Hanna Daring, Director, Field Operations, Zone 2, Mr Liton Mondal, APC Manager, Barishal were also present at the discussion.

The Barishal Diocese, COB is always ready for interreligious dialogue so that we all live in unity and harmony in this country and at the same time work together for peace and justice.

Clinic Based Community Health & Nutrition Programme(CBCHNP)

Community based health and nutrition program in Barishal and Dhaka Diocese is an ongoing program in five different areas. Since the beginning of 2021, these clinics have provided service to 931 patients. Among them 400 received service from the clinics and 531 at the door point. We took the challenge to work in the community during this pandemic period.



- We are raising awareness and encouraging everyone to keep social distance, wear mask and wash hands with soap.
- The nurse and the health workers are visiting door to door to provide service to the diabetic patient, measuring the blood pressure, pre and post natal check up to the lactating mothers.
- Five normal deliveries done at the clinic level and all the babies with mothers are well.
- In addition the physically challenged, aged people and the adolescent girls and boys are provided with counseling and required medicines.
- Immunization program is going on in our three clinics out of five.
- In March 2021, Mr. Suku Hazra (60) a tuberculosis patient received our service at his door step.

The Umoja Bible study groups are regularly get together and study the Bible and save accordingly for the social issues in Rajshahi and Haluaghat Deanery areas.


COB Remembers Professor Mrs Monika Mannan-An Educationist, Mentor and Dedicated Servant to Lord Jesus Christ.



Late Professor Mrs Monika Mannan was born in 1938 in a renowned Christian family in Rajshahi. Her father Rev. P.K. Barui, was a distinguished Christian Scholar and served as a prominent Christian Missionary Priest in Bangladesh. At the age of 6, she was sent to London Missionary School (LMS) in Kolkata to get her education started. She completed her higher secondary education from LMS and Bachelors in Arts from Calcutta University before she came back to Rajshahi in 1958 and later completed Masters in English Literature and Masters of Education from the University of Rajshahi. She further studied English Language Teaching at the University of Exeter in the UK and the University of Sydney in Australia. She also did her Bachelor of Theology (BTh) from Serampore College India. She started her professional journey in 1959 as Assistant Teacher of English at P N Girls' High School in Rajshahi. She was promoted as the Assistant Head Mistress in 1960, the youngest at that time in East Pakistan. Before joining as a Lecturer at Teacher's Training College, she

served as Headmistress in Sathkira, Kurigram, Bogura, Chapai Nawabgoni Government Girls High School and Pabna Edward College. She continued working for Teacher's Training College as a Professor of English up to 1990 until she took voluntary retirement and joined the Church of Bangladesh as the Education Officer where she travelled all part of the country to build the capacity of schools and teachers of missionary school of Church of Bangladesh. She later joined World Vision Bangladesh as the National Education Officer in Dhaka. She served as Chairperson of the Asian Christian Women's Council from 1990-1994. She was an Executive Member of the Christian Conference of Asia for many years. She acted as president of the Young Christian Women's Association (YWCA) of Bangladesh for a few years and is a lifetime member of Dhaka YWCA. She was in various advisory and leadership roles in various Christian organizations that include the National Council of Churches, Heed Bangladesh, Karamtola Christian Hospital, DASCOH Bangladesh, Kristiansand Rajshahi Friendship Committee (KRFC), Rajshahi Medical College Nursing Institute, Institute of Health and Technology, Rotary International Rajshahi, and Adarshaa Teacher's Training College and more. She came back to Rajshahi in 1998 where she continued as an Adjunct professor. She took a full retirement from teaching in 2018. She stayed in Rajshahi till her demise on February the 20th, 2021 at the age of 83. She was an active church worker and has a huge contribution to the empowerment of Christian women. She was a faithful servant to the Lord Jesus Christ and offered regular services at Rajshahi City Church. The last time she took a Sunday service was just a week back before her sad demise. She has left behind her only daughter, son-in-law, granddaughter, extended family and many well-wishers. Her illustrious professional and philanthropic Christian life has inspired many generations of Christian youth and women in Bangladesh. She left a touring legacy that will continue to motivate and inspire future generations.
