Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We were indeed in great trouble, agony, and anxiety in the month of July and August. Because many of our church members had suffered from the corona positive and some of them died in entire of three dioceses. The Synod office, Shalom office staff members also had suffered from coronavirus positive, among them Jones L Roy our publication and documentation officer! They

had to spend a lot of money for their treatment and all the family members were in great distress. Even our honorable Bishop Pholia also had suffered from corona positive, but thank God that all have been cured and living a normal life but they are very week physically. In the meantime, you also know that once those who are the corona positive, it might be many health complications in their lives. So we should be more aware of it and should be very careful and abide by the Government health rules and regulations.

I must thank all the Church partners of the Church of Bangladesh for their very sincere and powerful prayer support and encouragement. In the month of July when the delta variant had started attacking our people and when our people also started affecting by this very serious pandemic, I wrote a letter to the Church and Mission partners to pray for our country and for our church members those who been affected. I am happy that more than 25 Anglican Archbishops of the Anglican Communion responded with their prayer support. It will be worthwhile to mention that His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby phoned me and had a conversation and prayed and showed his prayer support and asked God's mercy and blessings for all of us in Bangladesh. Likewise, the General Secretary of the Anglican Communion, the friends of the USPG, the friends of the OM, UK, the friends of the CWM came up with their prayer support



for which I am immensely indebted to them and would like to convey our heartfelt thanks and gratitude to all of them.

May I note here that we mourn and pray for the soul of our Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman on his 47th martyrdom, 15th August 2021. We are grateful for his leadership in this land for ever.

All of you know that due to the corona pandemic the world has been

stunned and the socio-economic condition of the people of countries of the poor economy particularly have been facing a lot of distress, anxiety, physical and psychological problems, and its bad effects have been coming to the churches like the waves of the sea due to cyclone and natural disaster. Of course, we are aware of the natural disasters that happened and happening in Germany, Switzerland, Turkistan, Algeria, Canada, the USA, India, Haiti and so on. We are in full solidarity with them and incessantly praying for them. We are too aware of what is going on in Myanmar and recently in Afghanistan and the terrible, unprecedented humanitarian crisis happening and every day we have been upholding them in our prayer. May I request you to pray for the CoB and for the members so that in any situation we should be having our faith in God who is our refuge and strength.

"I look to the mountain; where will my help come from? My help will come from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let you fall; your protector is always awake. The Lord will protect you from all danger; he will keep you safe " (Psalm.121:1-3,7).

Therefore, existing of the Church, the body of Christ, is very much needed in this world to reveal the presence of God.

Barishal Diocese tried to reach out to people in various ways throughout the month and used digital technology to reach out to many with God's Word to assure all of God's presence and love.

Please uphold us all in your prayer as you are unceasingly doing it for us. We believe that it is your prayers and God's grace we are still moving on.

Madhupur Deanery News

A few programs are briefly reported.

Idilpur Parish Lay-People's Course: The Lay-People's Course introduced to 18 people at saintscndrew's Theological College has been completed under the guidance of Catechist Sumon Mondol. Certificates were distributed among them in the presence of Parish Priest Reverend Jonarson Dio.

This church house is built with tin shed and fence with the help of voluntary donations from Christians in the local church. It is noted that Hudrapur Church is a new Church. In the past, Christians used to gather here for worship in a small church with thatched fences and sheds. Moreover, it has not yet been possible to purchase land for the church in this church. We hope and pray for the lives of church members wealthy Christians and the church will extend a helping hand to purchase land for the church and build a permanent church.

After the Bible discussion, Bishop Pholia gave a basic orientation of using the ZOOM App. They all learnt it and now using it for various meetings and services organized by the diocese and others.

Shalom is implementing planned project's activities to maintain the announced Govt. health guidelines and office orders. In the recent COVID-19 pandemic situation project has been working regularly through continued to distribute masks, sanitizers and food items support to the targeted beneficiaries in the presence of local government officials to maintain social distance in compliance with mandated health practices.

Shalom has already achieved some major programs in Netrokona, Barishal, Haluaghat, Rajshahi and Meherpur area by the support of BftW, ICCO/KiA, TLMIB, MCC partners. Orientation and awareness activities are being conducted through yard meetings while maintaining social and physical distance of the targeted members. The



training, group meetings, and monthly advocacy meetings are conducted through groups with 12 people at a distance 3 meters of a safe area using a large hall room or open field. Training on diversified livelihoods, diversified livestock has been conducted by the concerned trainers. After the training programs participants received cash support for vegetable cultivation, vermin compost pit production, homestead gardening, resilience crops cultivation, long term fruit seedlings, agricultural demonstration plots, goat rearing, cow rearing, chicken and duck rearing. Shalom has also provided support for tree plantation programs and climate resilient local fruits cultivation in this month.



The national mourning day (Death Anniversary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, Father of the Nation) was observed on 15th August, 2021. End evaluation and staff interview nicely completed at Haluaghat MCC supported Integrated Food Security for the Aboriginal Community project. Vacancy announcement has been published in BDJobs for the Climate Resilience Sustainable livelihood Project for vulnerable People, Mongla and FD-6 has submitted in NGOAB for the WASH project funded by Tear fund.

Honorable Shalom Chairman Most Revd. Samuel S Mankhin's dream; 'All the staff of Shalom have increased their spiritual knowledge' and three months 'Lay People's Course' has been started online under St. Andrews Theology College. Every Saturday afternoon from three to five o'clock St. Andrews Theology College conducts classes with their honorable principal and teachers. 75 staff participating the online course from Shalom and certificates will be given to those who pass the course.

EDUCATION

In the present context, all the schools run by the Church of Bangladesh are getting prepared for physical classes. So repairing and painting, cleaning are going on in full swing for resume the classes. The students were given useful assignment to continue their studies in lockdown situation. The closure period announced by the government due to the effect of Corona is announced till September 11, 2021. Schools in the 2nd term are taking classes





Following institutional renovation and redesign, CMHR hospital has been continuing on its steady path in this new phase, as predicted. And we are happy the dreams of CMHR Board of Trustee (BOT) are coming true as hospital services are getting momentum day after day.

Relaxation of Nationwide Corona Lockdown



Children Health Checkup during Corona Lock down in country sides

The new COVID 19 cases began to come down nationwide in July-August 2021 and the entire lockdown was removed as a result. It has been a huge comfort for ordinary Bangladeshis, as it has made vehicle movement and the opening of public spaces much easier. The clinical service seeking patients are coming more easily now, notably in increasing number, to CMHR base hospital at Rajshahi. The hospital corridors are busier than before.

In addition, the CMHR's field efforts have accelerated. In Tanore Upazila under Rajshahi district, CMHR operated, in this period, 20 health checkup field camps with Food for Hungry Association (FHA) for their project children. More that 3000 children have been screened already. Check up camps would continue in next months.

Field eye camps are now frequently being organized under CMHR in selected communities. Such eye camps are crucial as they create bridge between communities and hospital paving the referral mechanism. It positively impacts the cataract services of CMHR Eye Department.

Breastfeeding Week Observed

The month of August was marked with World Breastfeeding Week this year. As usual CMHR had special emphasis highlighting the importance of this event. This year, the theme for breastfeeding week was 'Protect Breastfeeding: A Shared Responsibility'. A whole week from 1-7 August 2021 was dedicated for observance of this great event in CMHR. During this time CMHR emphasized on special in-hospital awareness initiatives on huge benefits that breastfeeding could bring to the health and welfare of babies and benefits to maternal health, focusing on good nutrition,

poverty reduction, and food security. The programs were specially designed for pregnant women and mothers. We were always scary to come out for work and to meet friends and colleagues due to high rate of Corona infection and mortality. It was very difficult situation when high rate of mortality for Corona cases in the Rajshahi division. God is always good for us, He protected us.

During the locked down challenges for Corona, NI activities were open and all staff have been working. The Principal, staff of the academic office and Nursing Instructors were active to provide online classes and solve other management issues. Many challenges arise and we did over come from those challenges by the grace of Almighty God.

The 1st year 49 students and 2nd year 41 students appeared for their annual examination going outside of our campus held on 22nd March to 4th April 2021. Their result has been published in July 2021.

The BNMC published their results on 7th September 2021. Out of 47 students 42 students passed their licentiate examination. Unfortunately five students have been unsuccessful in their examination. NI academic record show that they were good students and studious. These five students never failed in their previous exams.

Most of the students have taken 1st and 2nd dose of (covid-19) vaccine. Some of students had no National ID for their age criteria. They were failing to apply for vaccine.

Some of students have done NID from this Rajshahi City and registration is done for COVID-19 vaccine as well.

Ministry of Health and BNMC ordered that all schools, colleges and including all Nursing Institutes are going to open on 13th September, 2021. The students have started coming to the hostel who went home during locked down directives of the government. Some of the students were remained in the hostel for doing their clinical practical fearlessly during pandemic situations.

Currently number of students have come back in the hostel: 3rd year number of students 32 out of 41. 2nd year number of students 35 out of 49. Total students are now 67. New 1st year students not yet are enrolled. We are waiting for them when government will take admission test and declare eligibility merit list for Private Institutes.

I request to you all, pray for the Nursing Institute staffs and all students so that every year students can be successfully passed as a Registered Nurse from the NI to serve quality nursing, can be dedicated and efficient nurse to work for any hospital, clinics, NGOs, government hospitals nationally and globally.

May God bless us all and God safe and protect us from the pandemic COVID-19 and Dengue diseases.

We put our heads together at our monthly staff meeting and the result was a long covered shelter alongside the wall outside the hospital, giving respite from the rain and the hot sun shine, even allowing a night stay for relatives of patients being admitted at night.

The other misfortune of the month was many of our student nurses and the laboratory students went down with a bout of influenza- two to three days of high fever, making it hard to cover the ward work especially at night.

And at the same time several of their grannies and granddads in the G ward caught it too. They too got well quickly, but never recovered their mental health, and finally, a month later we lost two of them, Jhon and Robi, lovingly cared for by our 1st year students to the end.

A good news is that we have been able to repair and refurbish our hospital chapel which was leaking badly, tin roof horribly misshapen by the activities of countless monkeys over the years. The chapel now has a new green tin roof, gay walls and beautifully painted and decorated by our Doctors indomitable wife, and Doctor Christopher also brought a new luxury, carpeting for the floor replacing the sacking we have sat on over the years. We are grateful to them both for entering whole

heartedly into the life and work of the hospital.

You will want to know about the Covid-19 situation. There seems to be a general apathy about it all at the moment, as if everyone is bored and does not care anymore. There are cases obviously but the majority gets well.

In the village areas no one bothers to wear masks social spacing is an unknown thing. Life goes as normal, the only difference being the closed schools, and the children not

knowing how to pass their time.

Photographs in the daily papers show crowds of people jostling each other in the markets, bazaars and shopping areas, the majority without masks, completely oblivious to what the government is trying to tell them.

But at least people in general are now coming forward to be vaccinated, which is a good thing.

One big fallout from the closed schools can be seen in antenatal clinics, as hundreds of underage girls are being married off, and arriving to make cards and book in for delivery of their babies. Most give their age as 18 years (Government rules) but are obviously much younger. There is going to be a huge baby boom in the future.

We are all well and hope you are too.




OBITUARY
