

I thank God that I was able to hold the Kushtia Diocesan Executive Committee Meeting and followed by the "Annual Pastoral Conference" just the week after Easter Sunday. The theme of the Conference was "What are you doing here" (1 Kings 19:9b)? For all of us this theme was really thought provoking as well as contemporary. Once again, I express my deepest gratitude to the EMS for their support and commitment to promoting unity and solidarity within the Christian community.

We also express our profound gratitude to all the mission partners for their unwavering support in our mission to serve and empower the communities in Bangladesh.

We are grateful for our present government, which allows us the freedom to practice our religion and care for our fellow citizens. We recognize that not all countries have the same situation, and we feel blessed to be able to carry out our work with peace, unity, integrity, and harmony.

Once again, we thank you all for joining us today, and we look forward to sharing our progress and plans for the future.

The history of COB: In 1965, the Church union plan of North India and Pakistan resulted in the formation of the Church of Pakistan on November 1, 1970, which merged the Anglican Church, United Church, United Methodist, and Lutheran Church in Pakistan. Prior to 1951, the Anglican Church in East Pakistan was under the Diocese of Calcutta, but after 1952, Dhaka became a Diocese of the Church of North India, Pakistan, Burma, and Ceylon. The first Bishop of Dhaka Diocese was Rev. James D. Blair, an Oxford Mission brother. The Church of Bangladesh was established as a result of separation from Pakistan,

which was initially a language-based movement and ultimately took shape through the liberation war in 1971 that created a free and independent Bangladesh. Due to the impossibility of maintaining a relationship with Pakistan, the Synod of the Church of Pakistan declared and endorsed the free and independent status of the Church of Bangladesh on April 30, 1974. This process brought together the Anglican and English Presbyterian Churches under the umbrella of the Church of Bangladesh. The Church of Bangladesh acknowledges and remembers the contributions of missionaries and devotees who established congregations throughout the country and provided education, health services, and pastoral care, even in the remotest villages. The Church pays homage to their memory and holds them dear in their hearts and minds.

- We have 45 clergies including 2 female priests.
- The good news is that we ordained two women after two decades in COB.
- We have completed the strategy for COB visioning 2021-2030. Thanks to USPG, MC GB, and ACF for funding us, and to all the mission partners for their feedback, which we have included in our ideas and suggestions. Copies are available, and you may take them with you.
- There are ten major strategic ministries of COB, with pastoral ministry and selfsustainability (both economically and spiritually) as the main focus. Other ministries include those for children, youth, women, elderly people, physically disabled people, social development, child care, health care, mission evangelism and new church plantations, and theological training and education/school programs.

Through the generous contributions of Bread for the World, Kirk in Actie the Netherlands, the Tear Fund, and the MCC, we have been able to carry out various social ministry projects that have had a positive impact on the lives of many people. From providing education and training programs to implementing sustainable development projects, these partnerships have been instrumental in helping us achieve our goals and make a meaningful difference in the communities we serve. We are truly grateful for their support and partnership in this important work.

The United Society Partners in the Gospel (USPG) has been a crucial supporter of our Church in the areas of healthcare and self-sustaining projects. Their contributions have been instrumental in allowing us to carry out these important initiatives to benefit our community. In addition, we are thrilled to announce that the USPG will be partnering with us and the Diocese of Durgapur in a joint effort to combat Anti-Human Trafficking (AHT) in the region. This new collaboration will undoubtedly provide us with the resources and expertise we need to effectively address this critical issue and make a meaningful difference in the lives of those affected by it. We are grateful to have the support of the USPG in these important endeavors.

The Kirk in Actie Netherlands and the Church of Scotland have been supporting our SATC for theological education. We will follow up on their suggestions and advice for self-sustainability.

MC GB has been supporting us in our work for children, youth, women, evangelism, and the underprivileged community and new congregations. Sheila Norris will be visiting COB soon, and Martin visited last month. USPG visited last year. We would like to have more partnerships in terms of friendship and linkage.

We have achieved sustainability in running Rajshahi Mission Hospital and Nursing Training Institutes by the grace of God. Sister Gillian is doing fine and is still very active in Ballavpur Mission Hospital. Furthermore, we have been able to expand our services to reach even more patients in need, thanks to the dedication and hard work of our medical staff. With our focus on providing high-quality care and education to our community, we are proud to say that Rajshahi Mission Hospital and our Nursing Training

Institutes have become beacons of hope and healing for many who would otherwise have limited access to healthcare. We remain grateful to God for his blessings and to all those who have played a part in our success.

The good news is that we have achieved financial self-sustainability to run the pastoral ministry and provide salaries to bishops, clergy, and staff. This is a significant milestone for our Church, and we are thrilled to have reached this point. It means that we can focus our efforts on expanding our ministry and reaching more people in need, without having to worry about financial constraints. With this achievement, we can now invest in new projects, programs, and outreach initiatives, and continue to spread the message of love and hope to communities across the region. We are grateful for the ongoing support of our donors, volunteers, and partners, who have helped us to get to where we are today. Together, we will continue to make a difference in the lives of those we serve, and bring about positive change in our communities.

We have been sending clergy to do higher studies in the Philippines, with around ten about to complete their D. Min after their B. Th. from the Senate of Serampore. Some will be doing doctoral studies in the Senate of Srerampore and the USA online.

Thank God for CNI and CSI; we have a good friendship with them that has allowed us to work together toward our shared mission of spreading the love and message of Christ to all corners of the world, and their support and guidance have been invaluable in our efforts to provide pastoral care, and social services to the people of Bangladesh.

Thanks to God and all of you for supporting us during COVID through your kindness and prayers. We are truly grateful for your unwavering support during these challenging times, which have tested us in unprecedented ways. Your kindness and generosity have been a source of strength and comfort, helping us to overcome the obstacles that we faced during the pandemic. With your prayers and support, we were able to provide essential services and care to those in need and make a positive impact in the lives of countless individuals and families. We cannot express enough how much we appreciate your steadfast commitment to our cause, and we look forward to continuing to work together to build a brighter future for all.

New Churches in Khagrachhari



There are 9 new churches in the mountainous district of Khagrachhari in Bangladesh, The members are all indigenous, such as Marma, Chakma, and Tripura indigenous people. The new churches are located in a hilly area, so transportation is very difficult and risky.

Development opportunities and facilities are not easily accessible. The indigenous people here are very backward in education, hygiene, and economics. Church of Bangladesh is running primary schools in several new churches. Education, healthcare, and clean water supply are very important. Recently, two priests have been appointed for the continuous care of the new Churches of the indigenous people in Khagrachhari by the Church of Bangladesh. They are Reverend Ripon Roy and Reverend Ajoy Ritchil. In addition, several catechists from this area are also providing impeccable care to these new Churches. Regular worship, religious festivals, Sunday school, women's programs, and youth programs are conducted in each Churches. It should be noted that the Church of Bangladesh has been working on evangelism and the economic development of the indigenous brothers and sisters in the Khagrachhari hill district for nearly 15 years. Prayer is needed for the care of the new Churches in Khagrachhari.

47 people have received support for organic manure demonstration, 1500-liter plastic water tanks have distributed to 45 families for rainwater storage, 27 families have received hygienic latrines, solar lights have distributed to 22 families by the project.

By the support of Bread for the World (BftW), the Poverty Reduction and Community Resilience Project Phase II has started in Jobarpar and Netrakona area. The project design has changed in some of the issues and local beneficiaries and some old groups have been closed and new groups have formed.

Two days' workshop on project monitoring system development/monitoring platform was conducted by Mr.

Albert Eiden from Bread for the World, Germany. The workshop held at Jobarpar and all staff of the Jobarpar, Mr. Sudorson Mankhin, Ruth Sebika Raksam, Senoy Sarkar and Mr. Ronan Gomes attend the program. Mr. Albert Eiden visited the working area as part of the monitoring system development.

On March 21, 2023, Mrs. Monita Mankhin, the education Director of Synod, visited Telekhali Saint Paul's Mission School, Barujani St. Stephan Mission School, Panihata Saint Andrew's Mission School, and Katalmari St. Peter Mission School in the Haluaghat

and Madhupur areas. During this time, she discussed teaching, curriculum, various opportunities, and facilities in the schools, and provided guidance.



CoB-Christian Mission Hospital, Rajshahi



The hospital has been actively conducting meetings of the Board Members, and the most recent one was held on March 24 and 25, 2023. During the meeting, reports, development activities, and plans of the hospital were discussed.

The hospital is playing an important role in creating public relations with the community and increasing awareness about disease prevention through primary healthcare. The hospital is currently preparing to open two mobile clinics in Nimghutu Parish and Naogaon Parish. Medical teams have been sent to the mobile clinic in Nimghutu on Wednesdays every month for testing, and many patients have started joining Mission Hospital from these areas. The hospital plans to start a mobile clinic in Naogaon from June 1st.

To enhance the quality of indoor and outdoor patient care, the hospital has connected with good doctors in Medicine, Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Dermatology, and Gynecology. Additionally, the hospital has purchased advanced technology

machines for treatment and general operations such as pathology machines, ultrasonogram machines, laparoscopy machines, new beds, and portable x-ray machines for the dental unit. The doctors' chambers have also been modernized.

The hospital has been developed from 20 beds to 100 beds with infrastructure and manpower development. Seven more cabins with tiles and AC have been added, and a pharmacy is being built along with an outdoor patient canteen next to it and an indoor patient canteen that has been opened. The OT has been converted into two with modern appliances. The hospital has removed all the old electric lines and power lines and installed two electric power lines capable of carrying the load with thick and good cable connections. Digital billboard has also been installed in the hospital for advertisements and publicity.

The hospital has provided medical concession and assistance worth 29 lakh Takas to poor patients, especially for the poor santal community, through the Malakar Memorial Fund in the last year.

There are currently 201 officers and employees working in the hospital, including consultant doctor and both the BOT and Committee members. Out of this workforce, there are 84 Christians, 92 Muslims, and 25 Hindus.

It is worth noting that a Christian doctor has recently joined as a Medical Officer from April 2023. Additionally, last year, the hospital provided direct medical care to 22,306 people.

One of the weaknesses of the hospital is that many patients need to be referred to other facilities in Dhaka due to a lack of ICU unit in Mission Hospital.

Assistant High Commissioner of India visited Christian Mission Hospital, Rajshahi (CMHR).

On 29th April 2023, Assistant High Commissioner of India Shri Manoj Kumar visited Christian Mission Hospital, Rajshahi (CMHR). During the visit, he said that the hospital and the nursing school in the campus have been doing great philanthropic work for the society and the humanity not only by giving medical treatment for free or at a highly economical rate but also by spreading a message of love, affection and harmony. Delighted to witness the well-equipped facilities including operation theaters, specialized wards and highly motivated doctors and nursing staff, the highly dedicated team of the nursing school of the hospital established in 1926. The hospital aspires to have a Cardiac surgeon and acardic surgery facility.

The team CMHR highly appreciated the first ever visit of a representative from AHCI Rajshahi. Indian Diplomacy Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India in Bangladesh (High Commission of India, Dhaka) Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India.



CoB-Nursing Institute, Rajshahi

The Nursing Institute has been providing to the students training for Diploma in Nursing Science and Midwifery for 3 years course. After 3 years course completion they need to complete their 6 months Internship at Christian Mission Hospital. The Nursing Institute follow the Curriculum and syllabus from the Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery Council. NI students status: 44 students in 1st year, 52 students in 2nd year, 49 students in 3rd year and internship students was 40. NI had a total 185 students. Currently 1st and 2nd year 96 students are present in hostel. Our 40 students who was completed their internship on 10th February and went home. These 40 students attended their Licentiate or comprehensive examination on 31th March under the Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery Council. it was same date their result out and they all passed in successfully. Now they are waiting for form fill up for Registration Card. Our NI 3rd year 49 students has attended their year final examination on 13.03.2023 and ended 05.04.2023. Our 1st and 2nd year students internal test examination has been completed.
