I hope this message finds you well. I am delighted to share some significant updates and experiences that highlight our ongoing mission and evangelism work, as well as our focus and priorities for the future.

Recently, I had the honor of attending the South Asia Forum meeting held in Cardiff, which provided a fruitful platform for discussions and collaboration. Following this, we—the 34 primates of the Anglican

Communion, along with His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury—had the opportunity to have an audience with Pope Francis in Vatican City. This meeting was a profound moment of unity and spiritual renewal, reinforcing our shared commitment to the mission of the Church.

Furthermore, I embarked on a mission visit to Khagrachori, where I witnessed the dedication and resilience of our mission centers in some of the most remote areas. Accompanied by Revd. Ajoy Ritchil, we successfully visited several mission centers despite the challenging journey. Our travels took us through water, streams, torrents, heavy rains, and thunderstorms. We walked 5 kilometers through these conditions, navigating up and down muddy, slippery pathways and traversing several hills.

During our visit on May 18-19, we reached the mission centers in Notun Bagan Para (35 km), Dukhiram Para

who tirelessly work to bring the Gospel to even the most remote areas.

Additionally, I ask you to join me in prayer for the landslide victims and families in Papua New Guinea. Merciful God, we come with hearts full of grief and compassion for the people of Papua New Guinea. (32 km), and Alokbortika Para (35 km) in the Bhaibon Chora Union Parishad, as well as Lomba Chora (30 km) and Bhalukkhe Chora (35 km) in another Upazila of Khagrachori District. Despite the physical challenges, we experienced the Day of Pentecost 2024 profoundly, feeling our hardships were minimal compared to what St. Paul endured to witness the Gospel of Jesus. I also acknowledge that the Barishal & Kushtia Diocese is also enthusiastically running its mission and evangelical works.

Reflecting on our journey, I am reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul in 2 Corinthians 4:8-9: "We are hard-pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."These words resonate deeply as we continue our mission work, facing various challenges but remaining steadfast in our faith and purpose. Our journey, though filled with obstacles, is a testament to our unwavering commitment to spreading the Gospel and serving our communities.

As we continue our journey, our focus and priorities remain steadfast in mission evangelism, spreading the love and message of Christ to all corners of Bangladesh. I encourage all members of our Church to stay committed and inspired by the example of those

Devastating Landslide in Papua New Guinea - Call for Prayers

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is with a heavy heart that I write to you today following the catastrophic landslide that has devastated the remote villages in the Enga Province of Papua New Guinea. This tragedy, which struck the six villages in the Maip Mulitaka area early last Friday morning while most were asleep, has resulted in a significant loss of life, with many people still unaccounted for.

As we gather in prayer, we bring before you the grim reality:

- Approximately 4000 people called these villages home.
- 140 houses have been buried under the rubble.
- An estimated 2000 individuals are believed to be trapped beneath the debris.
- Nearly 670 lives have been lost.

The rugged terrain of these remote parts makes rescue efforts and aid delivery extremely challenging. Despite these difficulties, local villagers are doing their utmost to find and save survivors, though their chances diminish with each passing hour.

In this time of profound grief and urgent need, we call upon all churches to join in fervent prayer and compassionate action. We implore the community of faith to respond to this tragedy with an outpouring of prayer, compassion, and support. Let us stand together in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Papua New Guinea.

CWM Assembly held. Moderator Elected as the Board of Director of CWM



The Council for World Mission (CWM) Assembly 2024 took place from June 12 to June 19 in Durban, South Africa. Under the theme "Rise to Life: Together in Transformation," this quadrennial event brought together delegates from various countries to engage in fellowship, worship, and discussions focused on mission and transformation.

The Assembly saw participation from representatives of 32 member churches from 41 countries. Over 200 delegates attended, including church leaders, youth, women, and mission partners. This diverse gathering aimed to address global challenges such

as socio-political instability, environmental crises, and economic inequalities through the lens of faith and mission.

Moderator Elected as the Board of Director of CWM

A notable highlight was the participation of the Church of Bangladesh. The Moderator of the Church of Bangladesh, The Most

Reverend Samuel Sunil Mankhin, was elected to the Board of Directors of the Council for World Mission, making him the first-ever Bangladeshi to hold this significant position. This election marks a historic moment, showcasing the growing influence and contribution of the Church of Bangladesh within the global mission community.



The Reverend Dr. D.J Ajith Kumar of CNI visited Church of Bangladesh



Training of Trainers on Anti-Human Trafficking Held



A comprehensive Training of Trainers (TOT) program on anti-human trafficking was conducted at RPG Savar from 24 to 27 June 2024. The training aimed to equip participants with the necessary skills and knowledge to combat human trafficking effectively. The program featured three esteemed guests from the Diocese of Durgapur: Mr. Raja Mosses, Program Coordinator; Mr. Arnab Mondal, Consultant and Resource Person; and Mr. Shyamol Kisku, Field Officer for Anti-Human Trafficking. These experts led the training sessions, sharing their extensive experience and insights on the subject.

Throughout the four-day training, participants engaged in various activities and discussions designed to deepen their understanding of human trafficking, its indicators, and strategies for prevention and intervention. The sessions emphasized the importance of community involvement and collaboration in addressing this critical issue. By the end of the program, participants were well-prepared to take on the role of trainers themselves, spreading awareness and knowledge within their own communities. This initiative is a significant step towards building a network of informed and proactive individuals dedicated to eradicating human trafficking.

Church of Bangladesh Empowers Communities Through Workshops and Fellowship

In a bid to foster awareness and combat pressing issues, Church of Bangladesh recently organized two impactful workshops funded by CWM and USPG

Hosted at the serene Retreat & Prayer Garden in Savar, the Ecology Commission workshop focused on material development for ecological awareness, while the Anti-Human Trafficking Commission workshop emphasized IEC & awareness materials development. Under the guidance of Director Suvojit Mondal and the care of Rt. Rev



Hemen Halder, deans and commissioners pooled their experiences, contributing significantly to the workshops.

Simultaneously, in Thanarbaid, Modhupur Deanery, Church of Bangladesh, supported by the Anglican

Communion, convened a women's fellowship attended by over a hundred enthusiastic participants from Thanarbaid, Sridampara, Beribaid, and Idipur. Led by local women, including the inspiring Mrs. Monita Mankhin, and buoyed

by the empowering words of Mrs. Kolika Biswas, the fellowship served as a beacon of support and empowerment for women in the community. This dual effort underscores the Church's commitment to holistic community development and empowerment."

Awareness Training on Anti-Human Trafficking Conducted for Women's Group in Rajshahi

An awareness training on anti-human trafficking was successfully conducted for a women's group in the Rajshahi deanery. The training session, held on 28 June 2024, saw the participation of 70 women, primarily from tribal groups and border areas. The program was facilitated by Mr. Raja Mosses, the program coordinator of the Diocese of Durgapur, India, along with his dedicated team. The training aimed to educate and empower the women on the critical issue of human trafficking, equipping them with the knowledge to protect themselves and their communities from this pervasive threat. The session highlighted the signs of human trafficking, preventive measures, and the importance of community vigilance. By raising awareness among these vulnerable groups, the initiative seeks to foster a safer environment and reduce the risk of trafficking in the region. This training is part of a broader effort to combat human trafficking and support the welfare of marginalized communities, ensuring they have the tools and knowledge to safeguard their rights and well-being.



Shalom Project Aids Cyclone Remal Victims in Mongla

Mongla, Bangladesh—In response to the devastating impact of Cyclone Remal, Shalom's Climate Resilience Sustainable Livelihood Project has made significant contributions to support the affected communities. As the cyclone intensified and made landfall on May 26, Shalom mobilized its team to provide immediate relief and ensure community preparedness.

In the face of rising water levels and severe storm conditions, Shalom staff visited the most vulnerable areas, including Chila and Chandpai unions. They distributed essential supplies such as dry food, water, candles, and matches to those taking refuge in cyclone centers. A special effort was made to support pregnant women, the elderly, and children.

Shalom coordinated closely with local authorities and other NGOs, holding emergency meetings and planning rescue and recovery operations. The project also prepared a shelter at their office campus for up to 80 people.

This swift response highlights Shalom's commitment to aiding the Mongla community in times of crisis.

Success at the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Exam.



This year Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and equivalent examination started from February 15 and its result was published on May 12, 2024. This year CMCY supported projects altogether 241 students took part Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and equivalent examination. Among them 180 scored satisfactory pass marks and other 63 couldn't manage to pass. The successful students have taken admissions to different colleges. The average pass rate in SSC examination was 83.04% and CMCY had 74.69% only.

Key Approvals and Projects


The construction of 12 new cabins, the Operating Theatre (OT), and dedicated Post-Operative and Child Corner facilities have been approved.
